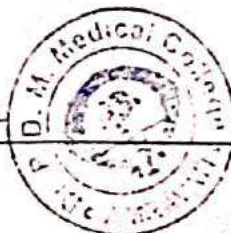



The solutions are diverse, most of them quite simple, but the overall challenge to scale remains unsolved.

Again, it was absolutely illuminating that the majority of the teams independently came to the common conclusion that the most important barriers reside in the domain of communication: communication with patients, with colleagues, in teams, across teams, across institutions, between institutions, in referral, etc.

As a reminder, the purpose of the 5 projects is about us all learning from one another's processes as we together go about developing insights and strategies for scale of the PPH Bundle. These learnings will be critical to informing what can work in going to scale nationally and globally. Most importantly, please remember that we are breaking new ground together. That means that no one can sit back and expect answers to come on their own. We have to be bold and creative, try new things, and share with one another what we learn. We know that traditional methods of scaling solutions have been disappointing for the most part. Our hope is to find a new and successful path for scale of the PPH Bundle, and together find a future that leads to healthier mothers and children across India and worldwide.

It appears that our next in-person workshop together will be in the last week of September. Early discussions are costs associated with these projects and your time is extremely valuable. We will send each of the teams \$2,000 USD immediately. Please send me complete wire instructions of an institution business account to transfer the monies. Additionally, we can provide up to a total of \$7,000 USD per team. Dear Dr. Junghare,

Thank you for putting our heads and hearts together for two days as we move into uncharted territory. As we know, PPH kills and disables an unacceptable number of women in India and on earth every day. The solutions are before us, most of them quite simple, but the overall challenge to scale remains unsolved.

Over the two days together, we took the very first attempt at developing honest understandings of what the real challenges are of going to scale with something like the PPH Bundle. There is no question that the PPH Bundle, if implemented everywhere a mother delivers, could save the majority of women with severe PPH. But, how can we successfully implement and go to scale?

It is absolutely illuminating that the majority of the teams independently came to the common conclusion that the most important barriers reside in the domain of communication: communication with patients, with colleagues, in teams, across teams, across institutions, between institutions, in referral, etc. We are on to something. No question.

The purpose of the 5 projects is about us all learning from one another's processes as we go about developing and completing the projects. These learnings will be critical in informing what can work in going to scale nationally and globally. My friends, you/we are pioneers in this!

So, here is what we are hoping for:

- 1) Each team of two medical colleges chooses one project to focus on and sends in their work plan and budget (templates included) by April 25th
- 2) Each team commits to an internal virtual (or, in person, if possible) meeting at least every two weeks
- 3) Each team commits to a virtual phone meeting with the MGH/Harvard team at least every month
- 4) We together choose two days in late July, August, or September to reconvene at MGIMS
- 5) Please return your thoughts, comments, ideas, edits on the PPH Bundle pocket card and wall chart, and please share any and all ideas

(Please note, while we did not focus this workshop on how the PPH Bundle fits within current clinical guidelines and training, we hope to discuss this further when we meet in a few months after the PPH Bundle is finalized and formally disseminated.)

Most importantly, please remember that we are breaking new ground together. That means that no one can sit back and expect answers to come to them. We have to be bold and creative, try new things, and share with one another what we learn. We know that traditional methods of scaling solutions have been disappointing for the most part. Our hope is to find a new and refreshed path to scale the PPH Bundle, and together find a path that leads to healthier mothers and better outcomes from PPH across India and worldwide.

Very much looking forward to working together and in solidarity with our commitment to ending PPH deaths.
